Classes for Children

The Children's Trophy

Children may enter all classes but Classes I and 2 are for those aged II and under only.

- I Miniature garden in container, no larger than 38cm x 24cm, e.g. seed tray, cereal box, ice-cream tub.
- 2 Design a poster to be used to advertise next year's show (template attached).

Vegetables and Fruit Classes

The West Wratting Cup

Plates should suit the size of the exhibit but must be no larger than 24cm across unless otherwise stated.

- 3 Five runner beans on a plate.
- 4 Five French or dwarf beans on a plate.
- 5 Three potatoes on a plate.
- 6 Three onions from either sets or seed, trimmed & tied.
- 7 Five small tomatoes (no larger than dia. 35mm) on a plate.
- 8 Three large tomatoes (larger than dia. 35mm) on a plate.
- 9 Three carrots (same variety) trimmed & tied in a bunch.
- 10 Three beetroot, trimmed & tied in a bunch.
- II Two courgettes on a plate.
- 12 Two or more of any vegetable not covered by this schedule. Two entries per exhibitor are allowed in this class.
- 13 Nine or more bernies, e.g. raspbernies or strings of currants e.g. red, black.
- 14 Two or more top fruit, e.g. apples, plums.
- 15 Two or more fruit not covered by this schedule, e.g. bunches of grapes, melons, rhubarb.
- 16 Four varieties of culinary herb (foliage predominating) displayed, for effect, in water.
- 17 The longest runner bean.

Cut Flowers Classes

The White Horse Trophy

- 18 Not more than three stems of one variety of rose selected for form and health.
- 19 Four stems of dahlias, mixed or same variety, displayed in water.
- 20 A single flower stem with 'wow effect', displayed in water.
- 21 A vase of mixed flowers containing five to ten stems of at least two different kinds of plants, displayed for effect.
- 22 A vase of flowers of more than one variety in shades of a single colour without additional foliage, displayed for effect.
- 23 Six stems of one variety of flower not in the schedule, displayed in water.
- 24 A posy of garden flowers in a small container, displayed for effect.
- **25** A cactus or succulent in a pot.
- 26 Any other pot plant not in category 25.
- **PV** Best scented flower to be judged by the peoples' vote on the day.

Domestic Classes

The Stan & Hilda Cox Cup

Please cover Classes 31–35 with clingfilm or alternative clear cover.

- 27 A jar of home-made jam.
- 28 A jar of home-made jelly.
- 29 A jar of home-made marmalade.
- 30 A jar of home-made chutney, relish or pickle.
- 31 Four ginger biscuits.
- 32 A wholemeal loaf (handmade; no breadmaker).
- 33 Vegetable quiche.
- 34 A Swiss roll filled with jam.
- 35 Four decorated cupcakes.

Photography Classes

The Ralph Westwood-Bate Cup

Each exhibitor may enter up to two images per class, noting which class each image is being entered for, plus a title (optional).

Photographs must have been taken since 1st October 2021 and submitted, as instructed below, by 5:00pm on Friday 5th August for judging on the weekend prior to the Show.

Rules of The Show

Please read The Schedule and these rules carefully. Not complying with them will lead to disqualification.

- I Exhibits may be entered by Club members and residents of West Wickham and Streetly End as well as visiting children & grandchildren. They may also be entered by residents of neighbouring parishes without horticultural societies of their own.
- 2 Entry forms must be completed and in the hands of the Show Committee by 11:00am on the day of the Show. Photography entry forms must be submitted by 5:00pm on Friday 5th August.
- 3 The entry fee for classes 3–38 is 50p. There is no entry fee for the children's classes (1-2). No more than one entry per class per exhibitor is allowed, with the exception of Class 12 and in the photography section where two entries per exhibitor are allowed.
- 4 Exhibits, other than for the photography classes (see left), must be brought to the Village Hall and staged between 9:30 and 11:30am on the day of the Show.
- 5 No exhibits are to be removed before the prize-giving. Exhibits not removed by the time of the auction or marked 'not for sale' will be considered as left for sale by auction; proceeds will go towards offsetting show expenses.
- **6** Exhibits in classes 3–24 and PV must have been grown in the exhibitors' garden or on their allotment. Exhibits in classes 25 & 26 must have been in the exhibitors' care for at least three months.
- 7 Only show stewards and judges will be allowed in the hall at the time of judging.
- 8 Any complaint must be lodged with the Show Committee in writing.
- **9** Exhibits must be shown in/on the exhibitors' own trays, plates, vases (with the exception of the PV) etc.
- 10 An exhibit may only be moved or rearranged by the exhibitor or a show steward.
- II The Show Committee cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to an exhibit.
- 12 Any prize may be withheld if the exhibits are not considered by the judges to be worthy of the prize.
- 13 Children's T-shirts will be produced after confirmation of sizes following the presentation.
- 14 Winners of the Banksian Medal in the previous two years are not eligible to win this year's medal.

If you are at all unsure about how to prepare and stage your exhibit the show stewards will be pleased to help you. A brief guide to exhibiting is available from the Show Coordinator and will be available to refer to on the day of the Show.
